## 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the SPICE Group Network

At the annual conference of ADT in the year 1991 the first meeting of what later became the SPICE Group network was held in Berlin, Germany. Participants of that meeting mainly were representatives of "would-be" incubators in Central and Eastern Europe. But Heinz Fiedler, at that time Executive Board Member of ADT, the German Federal Association of Business Incubation and Technology Centers, also invited participants from other countries to a roundtable discussion on a Sunday following the conference.

This roundtable showed a high level of hope and expectations for the coming development in entrepreneurship and innovation support in Eastern and Central Europe – and the need for access to information as well as possibilities for exchanging experiences West-East and East-East. Not surprisingly participants agreed that further meetings were necessary and volunteered to cooperate for making this possible.

This war the birth of an informal network that first was called ICECE Work Group (Innovation Centers in Central and Eastern Europe). Interest in participation was growing with every

In the year 1996 the network celebrated its 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary "Panem et Circenses" at the annual conference of ADT in Berlin. The 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary "Bridges to Innovation" was celebrated at the NBIA conference 2001 in San Jose, California. Now, the year 2011 is the year to celebrate the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of this network that still is informal and based on personal commitment of its members to innovation and entrepreneurship support. The SPICE Meetings of the year 2011 will focus discussion around lessons learnt during the recent two decades as well as how to meet the challenges ahead. The main celebration of the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of SPICE Group will take place at the Baltic Dynamics conference 2011 in Tallinn, Estonia, to he held September 2-4, 2011. An important part of this celebration will be a workshop on Creative Industries; their role for economic development, the supportive frameworks, and the functions of incubators.

A Latvia delegation visited Berlin to exchange information, experiences and views not only on business incubation programs and entrepreneurship support, but also regarding the role and influence of innovation related policies.

Under the lead of SPICE Member **Janis Stabulnieks** three Latvia experts participated: Ints Viksa, Valdis Egle (all three from the Latvian Technological Center) and Maris Igavens

ernment supported project to a privately financed incubator Another important visit was at the IGZ Innovations- und Gründerzentrum Adlershof. This incubator is one of the few in Germany that meanwhile is fully financed from income achieved by servicing the client companies. Florian Seiff and Gerhard Raetz also informed about the general experience from Berlin incubators.

The group also visited the VDI/VDE Innovation + Technik GmbH where Innovation Policies and experiences with governmental support programs were the focus of presentations and discussions. The VDI/VDE Innovation + Technik GmbH has several decades of experience with such programs in Germany and worked on projects for developing government innovation policies in many countries.

As the visit took place short before the Holiday Season, of course, exploration of two of the Christmas Markets in Berlin could not be skipped. So the Latvian Team also could enjoy "Glühwein" (hot red wine"), different



kinds of fried sausages, or "Flammkuchen" (very thin bread baked with all kinds of delicious supplements on top). Of course the handicraft offered at the stands gave many ideas for souvenirs and Christmas presents.

#### Kuala Lumpur: Global Innovation through Science and Technology

After a first "Leadership Circle Meeting" held in Alexandria, Egypt in December 2010 CDRF Global invited for a second meeting to be held in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia, February 21-23, 2011. This event is part of the Global Innovation through Science and Technology (GIST) initiative. GIST is one of the primary science and technology initiatives arising from U.S. President Barack Obama's June 2009 "New Beginnings" speech in Cairo, Egypt and is funded by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs.

CRDF Global's vision for GIST is to improve economic prosperity through sustainable technology-based innovation in the Middle East, North Africa (MENA) and Asia regions. Regional experts and leaders will gather to develop specific recommendations to catalyze innovation across sectors, including agriculture, energy, health and information and communication technology. These recommendations will guide the development of a funding competition for pilot project(s). At the Alexandria meeting, participants from governments and non-governmental organizations, universities, corporations, and foundations explored ways to advance key innovation areas, especially innovation capacity, entrepreneurship and access to seed capital. The Leadership Circle Meeting in Malaysia will continue this conversation and will include an examination of various models for technology

commercialization across topic area sectors as well as requirements and recommendations for the strategic partnerships.

The objectives of the Leadership Circle Meeting are to:

- Refine recommendations from the Alexandria meeting
- Examine existing models for technology commercialization across sectors
- Define concrete mechanisms and partnerships to catalyze innovation with a focus on the private sector and entre-preneurship
- Outline requirements and recommendations for such partnerships
- Develop selection criteria for a Request for Applications (RFA) for innovation pilot project(s)

This RFA will be officially published by CRDF Global following the Leadership Circle Meeting. Concurrent consultations with GIST partners—composed of representatives of both the public and private sectors— will also be held to develop a GIST Development Fund concept to further promote innovation systems in the targeted regions.

#### New on the Bookshelf: Development Guidelines for Technology Business Incubators

A new publication provides practical information about how to start and run a technology incubator. The "Development Guidelines for Technology Business Incubators "are drawn from the information used in supporting the successful development of Technology Business Incubators (TBIs) within the In-WEnt program "Business Incubation in Southeast Asia" [`bizi]. It has been promoted by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ).

These publication is written by **Franz Dietrich** and **Barbara Harley**, both long-term business incubation consultants, who implemented the Business Incubators SE Asia project during the period 2003 ¡V 2010 on behalf of In-WEnt, Capacity Building International, Germany. Editor of the guidelines is **Joachim Langbein**, senior project officer of InWEnt Capacity Building International and in charge for the [`bizi] project is the editor.

The publication draws much relevance for practical adaptation also from **seven case-studies** that were contributed by TBI project-leaders and or directors, whose names are mentioned in the beginning of the resepctive case-study.

The Guidelines are intended to be a general handbook and roadmap for both the initiators of a TBI and the team which is carrying out all of the necessary tasks. However, these guidelines cannot replace target-oriented capacity building one-on-one and group workshop measures as executed successfully in Indonesia, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam within the InWEnt [`bizi] project.

The guidelines follow a structural approach presenting each planning phase in a separate chapter in a logical order of activities. The methodology used aims at presenting key planning issues in short and easy format working with keyword lists, boxes, checklists and case-studies. The most relevant materials are directly integrated into the text. Additional resources are attached to the annex. In addition there are more than 50 complementary files uploaded to In-WEnt e-learning platform Global Campus 21 (www.gc21.org), which contain presentations, reports and planning tools from all phases of the InWEnt [`bizi] course layout.
